## **Guidelines for TUFS Study Support Program for Graduate School**

### **Article 1 Purpose**

These Guidelines provide for necessary matters pertaining to the TUFS Study Support Program for Graduate School (hereinafter referred to as “TUFS Study Support”) in accordance with Article 9 of the Rules for Exemption or Deferral of Tuition Fees for Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (established on July 28, 2020) and Article 2 of the Rules for Exemption or Deferral of Admission Fees for Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (established on October 1, 1975).

### **Article 2 Format of TUFS Study Support**

1. Students of Graduate School of Global Studies are eligible to apply for TUFS Study Support as stipulated in these Guidelines.
2. TUFS Study Support for students who were enrolled in or after AY2021 is referred to as Graduate School Master’s and Doctoral Programs TUFS Study Support; and Transitional Measures for Graduate Students for students enrolled in or before AY2020.

### **Article 3 Number of Exemptions and Selection Process**

1. The number of exemptions and the breakdown of the students exempted from admission and tuition fees under TUFS Study Support are shown in the following table. However, changes may be made subject to the budget determined by the Board of Directors based on a discussion at the Student Management Office Meeting.

2. Exemption from admission fees does not apply for existing TUFS students in the Doctoral Programs as they are already exempt from admission fees.

#### Article 4 Important Requirements

1. Students who have been exempted from the admission and tuition fees for the Master's Programs are assessed based on their grades at the end of each academic year.
2. Students who have been exempted from the admission and tuition fees for the Doctoral Programs are asked to submit a plan for their doctoral dissertation in the first year of their course and either a published paper or an unpublished record of their research achievements in the second year to assess the status of their studies in order to ensure they are sufficiently motivated towards their degree over the average degree program length. However, if a student takes a leave of absence to study abroad for research purposes, they are permitted to make their submission in the following academic year.

#### Article 5 Miscellaneous

1. If there are less than 30 TUFS students entering the Master's Programs through special selection (recommendation) who are eligible for exemption from admission fees through the Graduate School Master's Programs TUFS Study Support System, candidates from outside the university may be included.
2. In the Master's and Doctoral programs, exemption from tuition fees is, in principle, granted for the average degree program length for each program.
3. Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the carryover of exemption eligibility shall be permitted only for leave of absence for study abroad or overseas internships at diplomatic missions or similar organizations (hereinafter referred to as "overseas study and internships"). However, carryover of eligibility shall be implemented in units of the first half or second half of each academic year corresponding to the tuition fee billing period in each academic year.
4. The degree program length for students participating in a double degree program recognized by TUFS shall be the degree program length that is required by the participating program and eligible for tuition fee exemption under TUFS Study Support. However, if the required degree program length is less than two years and six months for the Master's Programs and three years and six months for the Doctoral Programs, the student is not automatically eligible for an extension of the tuition exemption period under TUFS Study Support. The tuition fee exemption period shall be extended every six months.

#### Supplementary Provisions

1. The amendments to the Guidelines for TUFS Study Support Program for Graduate School will take effect on April 1, 2025.
