About Courses

Elementary Course is an introductory course for those who are studying Japanese for the first time. In addition to learning hiragana and katakana, the goal of this course is to acquire elementary Japanese language skills through LIVE online Japanese lessons. By the end of the course, students will be able to introduce themselves in Japanese and talk about what they did on their days off. Students will also have a lot of opportunities to interact with classmates and the instructor in Japanese. There will be a pre-assignment and post-assignment for each class.

- Have never studied Japanese before.
- Plan to study Japanese for the first time after coming to Japan and would like to prepare for it.
- Want to learn hiragana and katakana.
- · Know only Japanese greetings (konnichiwa, arigato, etc.) but would like to learn more simple Japanese.

- Can read Hiragana and Katakana.
- · Can listen to and write Hiragana and Katakana.
- · Can introduce oneself simply.
- · Can ask and understand the price of things.
- · Can ask and answer the time.
- · Can ask and answer when to get up and when to go to bed.
- · Can talk about when, where, and what I do on the theme of "My Day".
