About Courses

This course is designed for those who have completed the first half of the elementary level (JLPT N5 level/know the plain form of verbs, adjectives and nouns). The goal of this course is to acquire Japanese language skills in the latter half of the elementary level through LIVE online Japanese lessons. Students will learn Japanese to achieve the task (a conversational task, a presentation task and a writing task) in each lesson. Students will also have a lot of opportunities to interact with classmates and the instructor in Japanese. There will be pre-assignments and post-assignments for each class. Kanji lessons will not be provided in this course.

This course is for those who:

- Have completed the first half of the elementary level (JLPT N5 level)
- Have passed JLPT N5
- · Are able to say verbs, adjectives and nouns in plain form
- Have scored 40/60 or higher on the level check test
- Want to review the elementary level
