Peace Laboratories (PEACELABS)

Information for the Projects' Applicants (Speakers)



What is a PEACELAB?



It is a platform for Youth from the globe to present innovative projects and stat-ups in the realm of Peace. The best projects will be awarded and get financial support. Each project is presented, discussed, and evaluated at the PeaceLabs (on-line or offline).



Each PeaceLab is devoted to a particular topic and linked to the morning sessions at the World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates.



A PeaceLab is organized by the PERMSEC in cooperation with partner Universities and international NGOs.



After receiving applications the PERMSEC Academic Council selects 5 best projects from the globe and 5 best projects from South Korea per each PeaceLab.



Finally Nobel Peace Laureates make their choice and select 2 best projects (international and local ones) to be awarded at the Closing Ceremony of the World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates.



Why should I participate in a PeaceLab?



To present your idea/start-up at global level and get expertise from the Mentors of the PERMSEC Academic Council on how to make your project more successful and implement it in your community more effectively



To receive financial support

After the preselection of the projects at each PeaceLab it will be presented 5 projects from local Korean Youth and 5 from International Youth. Finally, 1 local and 1 international projects will be awarded by a financial support



To get an access to a fantastic global networking of the World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates



Requirements for applicants



We seek effective makers to help us carry out our mission of sustainable peace and development for all.

You must be under the age of 35 years old. The presence

You must be present in Gangwon (South Korea) personally or join our events online.



How PeaceLab does usually look like?

Each PeaceLab is organized through the following scenario:

- A Moderator of each PeaceLab usually defines the issue that the PeaceLab should be dedicated to and make a brief introduction
- The Youth leaders selected by the Academic Council for the participation in the PeaceLab get the floor (max 7 min) to present their ideas/start-ups/projects
- The Academic Council Mentors and the audience may ask questions linked to the presentations
- The audience and the Academic Council Mentors evaluate each project by giving a score (from 1 to 10)
- The Moderator counts the voting results and prepares a Protocol
- The Academic Council Members present the results to the Nobel Peace Laureates who ultimately vote for 2 best projects from the PeaceLabs (one international and one local) to be awarded at the at the Closing Ceremony of the World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates

What should I do to apply?



2 PeaceLabs will be arranged in a hybrid format at the World Summit of NPLs in South Korea (you can attend PeaceLabs off-line or take part in it online)

After the pre-selection process You:
will be informed by e-mail if your project will have been pre-selected by the PERMSEC Academic Council
you will receive an invitation to be a speaker at the PeaceLab and its schedule

How my presentation should look like?



Each presentation* should consist of the following parts:

- **Part 1**: Why is that topic is very important for me personally?
- Part 2: Why have I decided to start working on that project/start-up or idea?
- Part 3: The key components of your project/start-up and the main steps/events
- **Part 4**: If you have already launched it, please describe the main steps of its realization
- **Part 5:** How many people are involved in my project? Do you have partner organizations and institutions for this?
- **Part 6:** What kind of benefit will my community receive in case of the implementation? How my project can help people to solve the above-discussed issue in case of its successful implementation? What will be the impact?
- **Part 7**: How I will promote my project (social media and other tools)

*Questions and suggestions from everybody who takes part in the PeaceLab. The audience (offline and online) may ask their questions as well.

The assessment procedure



After the deadline date (November 15, 2022) all completed application forms will be summarized by the members of the Permanent Secretariat.

To help narrow down the process, the Academic Council will be formed to present the best 10 applications (5 projects from local Korean Youth and 5 from International Youth per each PeaceLab) for the final decision.

The winners of the Peace Lab Project 2022 will be chosen by a selected group of Nobel Peace Laureates during the week of the World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates in Gangwon
