

Common Mistakes in ISEPTUFS Application Documents

Please double-check the application documents carefully before submitting them.

Late, ineligible, or incomplete applications will NOT be accepted for any reason.

Below are some common mistakes on the application documents:

【Certificate of Health】

• Applications with blank fields will not be accepted. The most commonly missing fields are as follows:

- 1 (4) Blood type (both ABO and Rh systems)
- 1 (6) Eyesight (numerical results are required)
- 5 (2) Anemia test
- 5 (3) LFT (numerical results are required)

• For the X-ray film number field, if no film number has been issued, please enter "N/A." If you are unable to undergo an X-ray examination for any reason, please attach a letter from your university or a doctor.

• For the following fields, if the result is negative, you must write "Negative." To distinguish from cases where the test was not taken, responses such as "0," "null," "-", "No," or "N/A" will not be accepted.

- 5 (1), Urinalysis: glucose, protein, occult blood
- 5 (2) Anemia test: Anemia

【Academic record at home university】

• Transcripts must be issued on or after the start date of the application period. If a transcript does not include an issuance date, or if it cannot be issued on or after the start date of the application period due to the home university's system or regulations, please attach a letter from the home university stating that the submitted transcript is the most recent available.

• All applicants must highlight the most recent semester's grades on the submitted transcript in yellow.

• JASSO scholarship applicants must underline the previous academic year's grades in red. If the previous academic year's grades are not available, underline the most recent semester's grades in red. If the grades are not underlined in red, it is assumed that the applicants do not wish to apply for the JASSO Scholarship, regardless of answer in the online application form.
