TUFS connects resources worldwide:

From the world to Japan and from Japan to the world (started in FY 2014)



TUFS was selected as a Top Global University by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) in 2014. With this designation, TUFS receives funding to serve as a key educational hub connecting worldwide resources under the slogan, "From the world to Japan and from Japan to the world." The three main targets of the Project are as follows:

- (1) Developing multi-lingual, globally-minded students and staff Joint Education Program / Study Abroad 200% / Double the Intake of International Students / Multilingual teaching curriculum / CEFR-J Project, etc.
- (2) Enhancing Japan's global presence

Promotion of Japan Studies (started in FY 2015)



The public university reform plan drafted by the MEXT in 2013 calls for universities to leverage their strengths and features to the maximum to achieve high added value that will make them more internationally competitive. Under this reform plan, universities redefine their missions to promote functional enhancement. For TUFS, this has meant establishing an educational and research system for Japanese language education and Japan studies from an international perspective. As a public university, TUFS also broadly disseminates the outcome of research on Japan, and these proactive efforts have qualified TUFS for the special financial assistance offered by MEXT since fiscal year 2015.

Inter-University Exchange Project



This is actually a series of projects is a series of projects that aim to nurture global human resources who can work on an international stage, and strengthen the global development of university education. These projects also aim to devise a guaranteed quality secondary education system while supporting international education cooperation efforts with universities in target countries/regions that implement strategic international exchanges of both national and foreign students. The Inter-University Exchange Project initiative was begun by the MEXT in 2011.


