Regulations Concerning the Implementation of the Double Degree Program Between Tokyo University of Foreign Studies and The University of Melbourne

October 24, 2023 Regulation No. 96

Article 1 Purpose

These Regulations shall provide for necessary matters relating to the Double Degree Program (hereinafter referred to as "DDP") to be implemented between the School of Japan Studies of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (hereinafter referred to as the "University") and the Faculty of Arts of The University of Melbourne (hereinafter referred to as "UoM") under the agreement executed between the University and UoM.

Article 2 DDP

DDP is defined as a program in which a student enrolled in the School of Japan Studies of the University is admitted to the Faculty of Arts of UoM while enrolled in the University or a student enrolled in the Faculty of Arts of UoM is admitted to the School of Japan Studies of the University while enrolled in UoM, acquires the credits prescribed by the University and UoM, and is awarded the degree specified by both the University and UoM.

Article 3 Study Abroad by Student of the University and Accreditation

- The students enrolled in the School of Japan Studies of the University who take the DDP (hereinafter referred to as the "University Students") shall study abroad at the Faculty of Arts of UoM and acquire the prescribed credits.
- 2. The period of study abroad of the University Students shall be eighteen (18) months, in principle. However, this shall not apply under extraordinary circumstances.
- 3. The University Students shall acquire at least one hundred and fifty (150) credits at the Faculty of Arts of UoM, of which at least one hundred (100) credits shall be acquired by taking at least eight (8) courses from among the courses set forth in the Appended Table. The requirements for acquisition of credits shall be in accordance with the regulations, etc. established by UoM.

- 4. Credits earned by the University Students at UoM shall be recognized as credits for the School of Japan Studies of the University in each of the course categories listed in the Appended Table.
- 5. The Guidelines for Overseas Study of Undergraduate Schools of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies shall apply mutatis mutandis to the procedures, etc. for the accreditation of credits.

Article 4 Acceptance of Students Enrolled in UoM and Accreditation of Credits

- Students enrolled in the Faculty of Arts of UoM who take the DDP (hereinafter referred to as "UoM Students") shall transfer to the third year of the School of Japan Studies of the University and acquire the prescribed credits.
- 2. If a UoM Student is admitted to the School of Japan Studies of the University, the Student shall be deemed to have taken sixty-two (62) credits for the class subjects as set forth in Article 7, Appended Table 3 of the Guidelines for Approval of Credits Already Obtained, etc. Before Admission to Undergraduate School of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies.

Article 5 University Graduation Requirements

- 1. The University Students and UoM Students shall acquire necessary credits in accordance with the categories specified by the School of Japan Studies of the University and shall acquire a total of one hundred and twenty-five (125) credits or more.
- 2. Those who have earned the credits in the preceding paragraph and satisfied other requirements for graduation shall be granted a bachelor's degree (in Language, Area and Culture Studies).

Article 6 UoM Graduation Requirements

The requirements to graduate UoM shall be in accordance with the regulations, etc. established by UoM.

Article 7 Miscellaneous Provisions

Any matters not set forth in these Regulations shall be prescribed separately.

Notes

- Credits acquired by taking courses other than those listed above shall be accepted as related courses of the School of Japan Studies of the University according to the number of credits acquired.
- (2) In principle, the University Students cannot take Japanese language classes offered at UoM. However, this does not apply in the case of the University Students whose native language is not Japanese and who take one such course per semester. In this case, credits acquired by taking such courses shall be accepted as one (1) credit for basic Japanese language subjects or three (3) credits for advanced Japanese language subjects in accordance with the class content.
