

## 1. What is ISEPTUFS?

### 1.1 Purpose of ISEPTUFS

Tokyo University of Foreign Studies offers International Student Exchange Program of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies: ISEPTUFS.

The program provides students with the opportunity to study in Japan and helps them acquire a firm understanding of Japan and the international community. Meanwhile, the program aims to promote meaningful cultural exchange and to contribute to the cultivation of outstanding professionals with international backgrounds. At the same time, TUFS seeks to achieve the goal of 'bilateral exchange in education between international and Japanese students'.

ISEPTUFS officially began accepting international exchange students from October 1998, and this year, 2026, will mark the 29th anniversary.

### 1.2 ISEPTUFS students

The ISEPTUFS program is an exchange program designed for international students who will study from three months to one year at TUFS. Students enrolled in a graduate school in their home universities can select either on undergraduate-level course or graduate-level course. ISEPTUFS students in graduate-level can take graduate courses in addition to those offered for undergraduate-level students.

### 1.3 Characteristics of the Program

In comparison to exchange programs in other universities, ISEPTUFS has certain distinctive characteristics:

- (1) Taking advantage of the 28 regional languages offered at TUFS, exchange students can avail guidance in their mother tongue from their academic advisors.
- (2) ISEPTUFS students can take subjects offered by the School of Language and Culture Studies, School of International and Area Studies and School of Japan Studies (with some exceptions), and they can study various specialized subjects or specialties, such as Japan studies and International studies. ISEPTUFS students in graduate-level can take master's courses in addition to those offered for undergraduate-level students.
- (3) Japanese students also participate in the ISEPTUFS elective subjects, therefore there will be opportunities for the international exchange students to make friends with Japanese students.

The above three characteristics of the ISEPTUFS program reflect the goal of 'bilateral exchange in education between International and Japanese students.'

## 2. Classes for ISEPTUFS students

### 2.1 Available Subjects

ISEPTUFS students are able to choose subjects according to their Japanese language proficiency and their interests (with some exceptions). The undergraduate-level courses consist of the following four groups.

(Some classes of <b><u>"Project-based Courses" and "Introductory Courses" are not available for ISEPTUFS students.</u></b> ) Some classes will be taught in English. |

## 2.2 Subjects not open to ISEPTUFS students

ISEPTUFS students **CANNOT take** the following subjects:

- (1) Major Languages (専攻言語) I~III e.g. English I, Chinese II
- (2) "Project-based Courses" (Class Code: 19J1001, 19J1002, 19J3101~19J3104), and Some classes of "Introductory Courses" (Class Code: 19J2001, 19J2005 ) in the School of Japan Studies
- \* "Survey Courses", "Major Courses", and "Specialized Courses on Japanese Language Skills" are available to ISEPTUFS students.
- (3) Research Seminar Courses /Graduation Project
- (4) Teacher Courses: Subjects related to Teaching, Information Skills
- (5) English A (GLIP English =Titled "Interactive English")
- (6) Study tour (which is held overseas)
- (7) Short visit program
- (8) Internship
- (9) Thesis Seminar (graduate-level) \*Class code: 60\*\*\*\*, 61\*\*\*\*, 62\*\*\*\*, 63\*\*\*\*
- (10) Classes in Peace and Conflict Studies Course (graduate-level)

### 3. Course registration

#### 3.1 Japanese Language Program (JLPTUFS)

ISEPTUFS students who want to improve their Japanese proficiency can take the Fundamental Japanese Courses "Integrated" classes and "Focused" classes. These subjects are offered as the "Japanese Language Program of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (JLPTUFS)". This program is organized according to Japanese proficiency and needs.

#### 【Placement test】

Those who wish to take the JLP course must take the online placement test, which will be held from March 18th to March 25th. Levels (100-700 or Upper-Advanced) are assigned according to grades. As a general rule, students should take classes at the level where they are placed. However, students are free to take integrated and focused classes one level above or below their assigned level.

#### 【Maximum number of Japanese language classes】

There is a limit to the number of classes students can take in the JLPTUFS.

100~600 Level Students: **up to 6 classes per week(Limited)**

700 Level Students: **up to 3 classes per week (Recommended), pre-consultation is required for taking 4 classes.**

Upper-Advanced (超級) Level Students: **not required (up to 3 classes per week if necessary)**

#### 3.2 Subjects aside from JLPTUFS

ISEPTUFS students can take ①Global Liberal Arts Program, ②Subjects in the School of Language and Culture Studies, ③Subjects in the School of International and Area Studies, ④Subjects in the School of Japan Studies (Except for some classes of "Project-based Courses", and "Introductory Courses"). Of these, the ones that are mainly taken are the subjects offered in English included in ①②③④. If you wish to take the classes, basically you must register for the course during the course registration period from April 7th to April 14th, attend the first class, and ask the professor/teacher in charge for permission.

Please refer to the website above. The "List of Undergraduate Subjects in English" also includes the Japanese language, education of Japanese, Japanese culture, Japanese economy and so on in English. Diverse Lecture-based subjects and research-based subjects that student can learn about Japan are provided.

### **[Other subjects offered in Japanese]**

If the students have sufficient Japanese ability to understand the lecture, they can take classes offered in Japanese. If you want to find the subjects in **Global Liberal Arts Program** / **School of Language and Culture Studies** / **School of International and Area Studies** / **School of Japan Studies**, please specify the "School" when you check the subjects through the Syllabi. If you see more than one class code for the same period and the same faculty member, please make sure to register for courses using the 7 or 8-digit class code that begins with "19".

### **[Subjects in Graduate School]**

ISEPTUFS students in graduate-level can choose subjects either in Graduate School (Master) except for Peace and Conflict Studies Course or Undergraduate School. All the classes in the Graduate School of Global Studies (Doctor) are not open to exchange students. (ISEPTUFS students in undergraduate-level cannot choose any subjects in Graduate School.)

### 3.4 Course Registration (For all subjects)

① Take an Online Account Orientation to get your "User Account" before the course registration period starts. (For online account orientation, the person in charge will contact you by email before the course registration period. Please follow the instructions.)

② During the course registration period, register the courses you want to take. Please see sections from page 11 on how to register courses.

Course registration period: April 7th, 10:00 – April 14th, 16:59

Course registration amendment period: April 15th, 10:00 – April 21st, 16:59

Registration cancellation period: May 11th, 10:00 – May 12th, 16:59

\*The times are subject to change.

**\*Course registration, modification, and withdrawal are not permitted after these periods.**

## 4. Course Registration Example

### 4.1 Make a well-balanced course plan

- (1) ISEPTUFS students basically choose 3-6 classes from Japanese Language Program (taught in Japanese) and 2-5 classes from the other subjects provided in Japanese or English. Please have a look at a list of the subjects and make your course plan.
- (2) Exchange Students must take **7 classes** or more for the student visa requirement and ISEPTUFS requirement.

### 5.1 Grading System

### 5.2 Inquiries about grades

If you think there are mistakes in the class grades, you can request, within a period set by the Student Exchange Division, an explanation from the class instructor through the Student Exchange Division. Please specify why you think the given grades are mistaken. Should you still have questions regarding the instructor's explanation, you can submit a petition for review to the Student Exchange Division. (Note, however, that you cannot petition a review for classes taken at another university through the credit exchange program.)

Please contact the Student Exchange Division for information on how to request an explanation or file a petition for the grades.

### 5.3 Approval of Credits

Transcripts will be issued for classes that have been registered and taken. Credits taken at Tokyo University of Foreign Studies will be recognized as follows.

Transcripts will be sent by email to your home university and you after the students complete the exchange program. (It takes longer than usual to issue transcripts for students who registered on ICL courses.) Students must consult their home university regarding credit transfer and equivalence.

### 5.4 Rules for Examinations

Cheating in examinations and submissions is subject to disciplinary action and academic disciplinary action. These will result in the student failing all courses taken in the same quarter or academic year.

3) Students whose period of study expires in February 2027 are not able to take any subjects during Winter quarter. If you need to take the course according to the regulations of your university, please come and consult with the Student Exchange Division with a request document issued by your home universities by November 30th, 2026.

## 7. Others

### 7.1 Working permission

(1) International students can work as part-time jobs for up to 28 hours a week with the prior permission of the Tokyo Immigration Bureau. However, sex industry or related business are excluded. Since TUFS has a quarter system, **international students can work as part-time jobs up to 28 hours a week even in summer/ winter quarter, too.**

(2) Please consult with your academic advisor in advance and follow the instructions so that employment does not adversely affect your studies.

(3) Please note, after completing your exchange program (August or February), leave Japan before your student visa expires. Moreover, after you finish the exchange program, you will not be able to work since your student visa is no longer valid as a student of TUFS.


1. Follow #1 and #2 of the above (How to check syllabus) and scroll down to the bottom of the page, and click "GAKUMU Information System."
