## Activities in practice:

#### (a) Rock-paper-scissors game

Rock-paper-scissors is fun whether you win or lose. The children were surprised when they heard words in foreign languages for the first time, but enjoyed the game nonetheless. We hope that the exchange students will remember this experience and continue to play this game after returning to their home countries.

Kyoju Murakami, a musician from Iwate who also studies Myanmar music, was invited to give a lecture at TUFS as a part of the Inter-University Exchange Project Japan Specialist Program for the Enhancement of Japanese Language and Cultural Outreach in Myanmar, Laos, and Cambodia. The lecture provided an opportunity for students planning on long- or short-term study in Myanmar to discover Myanmar music, culture, and society before traveling there. In order to make the most of the rare opportunity to discover Myanmar music, the lecture was open to the public. The 66 attendees included TUFS students and faculty as well as visitors from outside the university.

The lecture specifically discussed the contexts of musical performance in Myanmar, the types of traditional instruments, the musical scale, and the characteristics of Myanmar music in comparison with that of other regions, illustrated with sound clips and videos. Murakami pointed out that the peculiarities of Myanmar music include the presence of

elements acquired from various areas of the world and the use of the piano in traditional music

performance—both connected to the development of native Myanmar music with the use of Western

instruments.

The questionnaires filled out by attendees after the lecture included reactions such as the surprise of the

first encounter with Myanmar music and interest in the use of Western instruments in Myanmar musical

expression. A student who had studied in Myanmar was glad to have the chance to learn more about

instruments and music they were already familiar with. Another, who was planning to study in Myanmar,

hoped to listen to music there based on the interest aroused by the lecture.

After the lecture, Murakami was kind enough to continue talking for some time about the appeal of

Myanmar music. We are very grateful for his appearance as a lecturer at TUFS.

The Project looks forward to the opportunity to host similar lectures in the future.
