1: How to search for resources in T.U.F.S.





What is "Call number"?

The call number labels are attached to the spine of library books. Each call number label consists of four columns.

First line of the label indicates the language in which the book is written, or the language on which the book is focusing. For example, "K" means English. Second line of the label indicates the subject. For example, 382 indicates "Customs, folklore and ethnology". Please refer the appendix for more details.

TLL (TAC Library Lending) is a mutual cooperation service, which allows you to use to borrow the materials held by oher TAC libraries. You can get the materials from other institutions at the TUFS Library Service Counter. You don't have to pay any fees.

To get the information of the materials, search on TACOPAC.

4 : How to use resources from outside of the campus

A: Print resources (Books by mail)

You can apply for "Books by mail" service from My Library. Please note that you can only apply for 2 books at once. You do not have to pay a service fee, but you need to pay a shipment fee when you return the books to the library.

The majority of the books in the library's collection are classified according to two main concepts: language and subject. Based on these concepts, each book is assigned a call number, which is affixed to the spine of the book as a book label. The materials on each floor are arranged according to these call numbers.

Other collections, such as rare books and special collections, are also classified according to their own system.
